- 1. Current E&W Committee Chairwoman Virginia Foxx (NC) is term limited and will not return as Full Committee Chair for the 119th Congress. This leaves the gavel open to an internal Republican caucus vote to determine the next Chair. Three senior members of the Committee in the majority are running for the Committee's top position Joe Wilson (SC), Tim Walberg (MI), and Burgess Owens (UT).
- 2. While the Republicans have retained control of the U.S. House of Representatives, there will be at least five, and possibly six, seats on the E&W Committee vacated as a result of Representatives who either retired to seek other office, did not seek re-election, were unsuccessful in their bid for re-election in the 2024 Elections, or have recently been nominated by President-elect Trump for a position within the Administration. Similarly, four Democrats also fall into this category. Combined this opens up either nine or ten seats on the Committee to be filled in January. Many of the seats on both sides of the isle are likely to be filled by new, incoming elected officials who won races in the 2024 Elections.
- 3. "Representative Elise Stefanik (NY) will vacate her seat as a member of the U.S. House of Representatives, and therefore her E&W Committee membership, as she has been selected for appointment as the U.S. Ambassador to the United Nations by President-elect Donald Trump.)
